Providing Immigration Legal Services to Those With a Legal Pathway

For 25 years, lust Neighbors has served more than 15,000 clients from 150 countries by helping low-income immigrants obtain the documentation to which they are legally entitled. We believe that investing in immigration legal services positively impacts a family's overall stability in the United States. Requiring individuals to pay expensive fees for these services forces families to choose between paying for legal services or for basic needs like food and housing. Research shows that granting legal status and citizenship to immigrants increases their income level, chances of home ownership, education level and access to health care.

Focusing on humanitarian cases, Just Neighbors staff attorneys and many volunteers serve the most vulnerable immigrants in our community, many who are:

- Refugees and asylees
- Survivors of domestic violence and other violent
- Dreamers (immigrants brought to the U.S. as children)
- Temporary Protected Status (TPS) recipients because of armed conflict or natural disasters
- Families seeking general advice about their status
- Trafficking victims
- Asylum seekers

Just Neighbors is able to respond to the changing immigration legal framework because of our unrestricted funding from private foundations, donors, corporations and faith communities.


